Did you Know

Within any 10-mile radius of our church you will find so many types of worship, styles of worship and even a different focus of those worship services. In my years attending and planning worship we have seen Cowboy church, Traditional church, and Contemporary/blended church. Even within these worship formats, no two are the same. We heard choirs in cathedrals supported with pipe organs and guitars being used in a barn. We have seen clergy in robes and clergy in jeans. We have seen it all.

But the question that should be asked is: **What does God want from worship?** Too often after worship, folks would leave the church and say to me in my role as a church pastor: "Nice service, I really enjoyed it? Enjoyed it?" I always asked them: "But what part of worship did you truly encounter the living Christ? The music? A scripture reading? Part of a sermon? Someone's testimony? Singing Happy Birthday?" What part in the service did you truly worship?

Let us look at scripture to see what God wants. There are too many to list, so I selected some scripture for this topic. You can do your own search: Each of these should inspire enthusiastic worship as you **Come**, **Hear**, **Respond and Go**.

<u>John 4:23</u> But the hour is coming, and is now here, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for the Father is seeking such people to worship him.

Psalm 150:6 Let everything that has breath praise the LORD! Praise the LORD!

<u>James 5:13</u> Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray. Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing praise.

<u>Psalm 95:6</u> Oh come, let us worship and bow down; let us kneel before the LORD, our Maker! <u>Hebrews 12:28-29</u> Therefore let us be grateful for receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, and thus let us offer to God acceptable worship, with reverence and awe, for our God is a consuming fire.

<u>Psalm 29:2</u> Ascribe to the LORD the glory due his name; worship the LORD in the splendor of holiness.

Romans 12:1-2 I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect.

<u>Luke 4:8</u> And Jesus answered him, "It is written, "'You shall worship the Lord your God, and him only shall you serve."

<u>Isaiah 25:1</u> O LORD, you are my God; I will exalt you; I will praise your name, for you have done wonderful things, plans formed of old, faithful, and sure.

Revelation 4:11 "Worthy are you, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honor and power, for you created all things, and by your will they existed and were created."

<u>1 Chronicles 16:29</u> Ascribe to the LORD the glory due his name; bring an offering and come before him! Worship the LORD in the splendor of holiness;



Passionate Worship

The vision of the GMC is rooted and grounded in making disciples. Period. No excuses. No apologies. No pretenses. No regrets.

To make that vision a reality requires a commitment to personal holiness as defined by Scripture and lived out in the three basic foundation blocks: passionate worship, extravagant love and bold witness. Last month, we touched upon worship; this month, let's look at BOLD WITNESS.

First, how do you imagine or define bold witness? Is it standing on a street corner with a bullhorn declaring "TURN OR BURN" to everyone you see?

Is it giving a New Testament or a Bible tract to everyone you ever meet?

Is it having a bright neon, glow-in-the-dark orange "Honk if you love Jesus" bumper sticker on your vehicle?

The answer to that first question begins with your answer to one other question: Who is Lord of your life? Is Jesus Christ "the" Lord of your life or is He someone to whom you pledge allegiance but is not exactly a "lord" at all?

In today's secularly-driven culture, being a "storefront" Christian is about as far as most folks go in making Jesus Lord and Master of one's life. Our culture's insistence and emphasis upon "being my own person," or "following my own heart" does not equate with making Jesus Christ Lord and Messiah.

When you make Jesus "Lord of your life," you give up all pretense of being your own person and embrace the concept of becoming more like Jesus minute by minute, hour by hour, day by day.

Many would call that an "obsession" and that's exactly what it is: an obsession to be like Jesus so much, both inwardly and outwardly, that in your living you become the "bold witness" for Christ which disciples of Christ are called to be. Your life as a disciple of Christ; your actions, your words, your way of treating and relating to others; the empathy and sympathy you share with others is "the" best witness anyone will ever hear or see.

That's tough, I know. It's not easy being a sold-out, dedicated disciple of Jesus Christ. If it was easy, everyone would be doing it and that narrow road of which Jesus spoke numerous times would be filled to overflowing capacity with disciples. But we know that narrow road is not overcrowded because the wide, not-a-path-to-Jesus is far, far more comfortable and easy.

When Jesus Christ is your Lord; and you become the bold witness Jesus wants you to be, He gets to tell you whose feet you will wash; where and whom you will serve....and not the other way around. Because if you want to cling to the idea that you can tell Jesus whose feet you will or won't wash; what folks you or won't serve or welcome; then you are in fact the lord of your life and Jesus is not Lord of your life.

I know, that's a hard statement. I know, that's not an easy thing to hear. I know, it's not a great advertising slogan. I get all that. And so does Jesus.

John Wesley's great Covenant Prayer is a wonderful New Year's lesson to remind us of how we can make Jesus Christ Lord of our life.

Here it is paraphrased:

Lord Jesus Christ, I am no longer my own, but I am Yours.

Put me to what You want me to do: put me with whom You want me to serve.

Put me to witnessing; put me to suffering.

Let me be at work for You or put aside for You.

Let me be acclaimed in Your name or persecuted for You.

Let me be full of Your arace or let me be empty.

Let me have all things or let me have nothing.

I willingly and fully yield all my life and everything I am to You.

And now O glorious and Blessed Lord; Father, Son and Holy Spirit, I am totally Yours. So be it. And this covenant I now make here on earth, let it be approved and endorsed in Heaven. Amen.

Why do we all have different passions? So everything that's supposed to get done will get done.


Sometimes we get overwhelmed because we are constantly exposed to people with various passions for service, and when they represent their cause, they are so committed to that which has captured them that we feel guilty for not sharing their zeal. We seem indifferent in comparison.

When I was in college, we had chapel every day and almost every day we heard a message from someone who had a passion for some particular ministry. They were usually in some ways recruiting us for service, whether it was in missions, or in the church, or in society, or among the poor. It was overwhelming, and often frustrating, because everyone made every concern sound like the only thing any caring person would support.

The same thing happens in our churches. Sometimes we feel guilt because we don't have the same passion as the last person who talked about missions, or abortion, or the homeless, or marriage, or singleness, or men's ministry, or AIDS prevention, or prisons, or evangelism, or the military. What we forget is that there are so many needs because there are so many of us to meet them. We aren't supposed to get our bell rung by every appeal that comes by. We are a body made up of different parts and different hearts; we don't have to all be moved by the same issues and needs.

This is where the concept and the practical nature of spiritual gifts come in. There are a variety of gifts and there are a variety of ministries, but the same Lord working in all and through all. No one has to do everything; no one can. It is up to us to find out where we fit and what God put us here to do. Soon you will be just as passionate about something because it's your thing. This is the way it's supposed to be. We only get frustrated when we forget this and try and take on everything, or get so overwhelmed that we take on nothing at all.

All of this should just make us marvel at the wisdom of God even more. He's designed us all with different abilities and different interests so that we are not only good at what we do, we do not have to be frustrated or depressed over what we aren't good at. When we all do our part in the body of Christ, everyone gets a job, everyone gets honored and everyone's important. That's the way it's supposed to be.

Coming in 2025, Transformational Small Groups!

What is a Transformational Small Group?

A "Transformational Small Group" takes place in a small group setting, designed to facilitate significant personal growth and spiritual development among its members through deep sharing, accountability, and intentional focus on applying teachings to daily life, leading to meaningful life changes and a closer relationship with God; it goes beyond just studying information to actively cultivate transformation in individuals within the group.

Key points about Transformational Small Groups:

- •Deep relationships- Members build strong connections with each other, fostering a safe space for vulnerability and honest sharing.
- •Active participation- Emphasis on applying teachings to personal situations and actively reflecting on how to live out faith in daily life.
- •Accountability- Group members hold each other accountable for their commitments and spiritual growth.
- •Leader focus- Leaders are trained to guide meaningful discussions and encourage personal reflection.
- •Kingdom-oriented- Focus on how to live out faith in service to others and advancing God's kingdom



The wait is over! I am blessed beyond belief to announce to you that a new small group experience at Knightsville Methodist Church is ready to launch. You have been hearing about it for several months and now we are finally ready to begin to form groups.

First, let me give you a brief introduction. The name says it all. **Going Deeper**, because we seek believers who have a desire to go deeper in many aspects of their relationship with Jesus Christ and others in their small group of fellow believers. The **TLC** part of the name is a catchy way to describe what happens to a group participant as they "Go Deeper." They begin to experience TLC that is "Transforming our Lives through Christ" as a by-product of meeting weekly to pray for the Holy Spirit to come and join them as each member of the group has a "**Sharing The Faith**" moment. While sharing your faith with each other you will talk with each other about your daily and regular **Acts of Piety**, that keep you centered on God's Word. You will share and hear about specific events and times from the past week where you **felt the presence of Christ** walking beside you in your life. You will share, and hear about encounters where you had the opportunity **to be God's beacon of hope for somebody**. In addition, you will share how you and the others feel that **your faith has been tested**. Individually you will declare and hear from others about their **plan for study and action for the coming week**, in order to see our lives through the lens of Christ. Finally, the group will intimately **share prayer requests**, **concerns and praises**. Sounds a little different, right?

This may sound intimidating to some, but don't discount the transformational power of developing close knit bonds with other believers and hearing that we all have the same fears, trials and tribulations. There is something miraculously transforming when you hear stories from others as they recall times from their week where they encountered a situation or event where they felt the closeness of Christ. You will begin to look for and note these occurrences in your own lives, just so you can share at the next small group meeting. And as you transform, your group members will transform. And as the groups transform, our church will begin to transform as well.

Well, are you ready to blast off with us?

Here is a list of the current groups that are open to join.
