Words of Encouragement

The Door to Your World

One of John Wesley's absolutes was that a person's road to righteousness was totally dependent on the grace and mercy of God. He held firm that our ability to become righteous had nothing to do with ourselves but only through the presence of the Holy Spirit working in and through the lives of Disciples of Jesus Christ. It is through God's Spirit that we are constantly being shaped, molded, and transformed into His likeness. Becoming like Jesus is a long, slow process of growth. Growing into righteousness is a gradual process and will take the rest of our lives. In Paul's letter to the church of Ephesus he emphasized that our spiritual journey "will continue" until we are...mature, just as Christ is, and we will be completely like him." Wesley contended that we can be vessels that bear the love of God to the world and share the treasures of his grace only if the vessel of our soul is daily refilled, only if we feed upon our daily bread that is the manna of grace. In essence, it is the responsibility of all disciples to make disciples for the transformation of the world. As Christians, it is our personal accountability to Jesus' call to the Great Commandment (Matthew 22:35-40) and the Great Commission (Matthew 28:16-20) if we are to build His kingdom.

Wesley identifies in his sermon, The Means of Grace, that God works in mysterious ways to reach out and touch his people in their quest for spiritual maturity. Wesley defines them as outward signs, word, or actions ordained of God...to be the ordinary channels whereby he might convey to men presenting, justifying, or sanctifying grace. Wesley recognized that holiness of word, thought, and action were not possible by nature or a desire to do good; they were possible only through the cultivation of what Wesley called holy tempers, of which love is the greatest and the source of all other tempers. The tempers are habitual dispositions of the heart that allow the actualization of our intention to be holy. Yet, such tempers, though at times spontaneously infused by sanctifying grace, more often need to be nurtured through a cultivated relationship with the Spirit.

These forms of grace are both internal and external in nature. Piety is an inward work of grace that will bring forth an awakening presence of God that touches our heart. Through the intentional practices in the spiritual disciplines of prayer, Bible study, meditation, worship, evangelism, and communion we are constantly growing in our awareness of God presence in directing our lives. Even more than the disciplines of piety, works of grace through mercy express God's love to a hurting world that so desperately

needs witness to the Gospel of the Good News. In the Book of Ephesians, it outlines our true purpose as it relates to how we have been called to serve others. "It is God himself who has made us what we are and given us new lives from Jesus Christ; and long ages ago he planned that we should spend these lives in helping others." Grace of mercy include doing good works, visiting the sick/homebound, visiting those in prison, feeding the hungry, and passionately attending to the needs of others.

As Christians, we should always be alert to God's presence in seeking justice, ending oppression and discrimination, and addressing the needs of the poor. In retrospect, throughout the years God has moved and directed me into various church leadership positions (different churches / denominations), teaching assignments, mission work, lay speaking and certified teaching, Stephen Ministry, and Bible Study Fellowship to just name a few. It would be hard for me to pinpoint the exact means of grace or spiritual discipline that has been most meaningful. I'm kind of that piece of gray clay that God has been molding for a long time and still is in the design stage. At various crossroads of my spiritual journey, he has always positioned me in areas that have deepened my faith and enriched my life. In all these situations it is now evident that they were the foundation to a greater overall **purpose** he had me being prepared for – to serve and love the least, lost and lonely. I surely accept the blessing He gives in Romans 8:28 "In all things Gods works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose."

Cindy and I hope that this year brings you the "alleluia celebration" that opens your hearts and minds to further pursue God's purpose for your life. Always remember that in discovering your purpose you must turn to God's Word, not the world's wisdom. You must build your life on eternal truths, not the latest and greatest pop-up culture of the day. The Bible says, "This is the message from the one who is holy and true. He has the key that belonged to David, and when he opens a door, no one can close it, and when he closes it, no one can open it. I know your deeds; I know that you have a little power; you have followed my teaching and have been faithful to me. I have opened a door in front of you, which no one can close."

Let's not ever forget, we are "the most loving place in town!"

Did you Know?

This February at Knightsville Methodist we will celebrate I am Second day on 23 February...but the actual day of worldwide celebration is February 22 or 2.22. What is I am second? When did it start and how will we participate at KMC? These are all good questions.

In 2008, a small group of Christians in the Dallas-Ft. Worth area met to discuss their mutual calling **to share the hope of Jesus** to their hometown. The conversation quickly moved to a bigger vision and key question: *How to convey that hope to as many people as possible.*

That question was answered with three words: I Am Second. Through the art of storytelling/testimonies, they captured raw stories of real people talking about the real Jesus who transformed their lives for the better. And we at KMC all have our transformed stories to share as well.

Today, I Am Second has grown into a global movement. The iamsecond.com, site is where people can now watch the stories and find next steps in their life journey.. The website is filled with people who have put God First and then take part in the ongoing process of living like Jesus, serving like Jesus and loving like Jesus. We get to share His story – the gospel – with others to weave us all together in community. These are the things we at KMC presently do and we want to continue. If you are not doing this or need help, then then the I am second wristband may help you.

On Sunday 23 February our worship service will focus on the idea of being second and putting God first in our lives. I am Second wristbands will be presented to everyone during worship. Participation is purely voluntary. A Spiritual Vitamin about how to put God first will be the message of the day.

Susan and I have participated in this program since 2011, and it has been a joy to answer questions when people ask us: *What does that mean?* We tell them that we put Jesus first in our lives. That is it. If they ask more...then we shared more of our faith story. In many cases we offered our wristband to the person who asked the question. Many take it and begin to immediately wear it. Then on Sunday during Joys and Concerns, we get to share the story about that person and the interaction and pick up a new wristband and start all over again just waiting for someone to ask us. *What does that mean?* We just smile and get excited about sharing one more time.

The wristband is a conversation starter...It makes it easy for folks, who are not comfortable about sharing, to answer the question and give a short testimony. We hope you will step up during worship on February 23 and join the movement. I am second. Have you put Jesus first?

Meet Your Pastor



Pastor Bill Masciangelo is a native of Pine Beach, NJ. He graduated from Admiral Farragut Academy; a Naval Academy Preparatory school prior to attending St. Francis University for four years graduating with a teaching degree with a history concentration. Upon completion of his degree, he was commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant in the United States Marine Corps.

A combat veteran of Vietnam, he served in a variety of increasingly responsible leadership and staff positions during his military career. His last four years in the Marine Corps

were spent serving as the Marine Corps Representative at the Naval Command College working with senior naval Officers and their families from over forty countries.

Pastor Bill is the author of the "Military Reunion Handbook: A Guide for Reunion Planners." One of his favorite memories, while working closely with veterans, was his two-week experience escorting WWII veterans back to Normandy for the 50th Anniversary of the D-Day invasion.

After his retirement from the Marine Corps after 20 years as a Lieutenant Colonel and a servant-leader, Pastor Bill then entered his second career; Hospitality. Here he honed his service and hospitality skills with such companies as Sheraton Hotels, Holiday Inn Hotels and Wyndham Hotels and Resorts. Pastor Bill served in a variety of operational, sales and marketing positions, with these major hotel companies.

While living in Polar Branch, NC serving as the President of Blackwater Training Center and attending Sharon UMC, Pastor Bill began to realize that he was being called to full-time ministry serving the Lord. On June 26th, 2007, he assumed the full-time position of Pastor at New Hope United Methodist Church. He then served as Pastor at The New Moyock UMC in Moyock, NC. In July, 2017 he retired and moved to Del Webb.

Since moving to Summerville, he has served as Pastor at Smyrna UMC located on Cypress Gardens Road in Moncks Corner. In 2023 he retired from full time ministry. Bill and Susan love to travel in their Motorhome and plan to continue travel in the years to come.



The Stephen Ministry was started in 1975 by pastor and Clinical Psychologist Kenneth Haugk. Stephen Ministers are not counselors; they are trained lay caregivers. Their role is to listen and care – not to give advice or counsel. Stephen Ministers listen, understand, accept, and pray for you as you go through a struggle or life challenge. They are also trained to recognize if your needs exceed what they can provide.

More than 13,000 congregations are enrolled in the Stephen Ministry and represent at least 190 Christian denominations in the U.S., Canada and 30 other countries. In addition,

more than 600,000 people have trained as Stephen Ministers (5 of them here at KMC).

The name "Stephen" comes from St. Stephen, who was the first lay person commissioned by the apostles to provide caring ministry to those in need (as recorded in Acts 6).

Coming in 2025, Transformational Small Groups!

What is a Transformational Small Group?

A "Transformational Small Group" takes place in a small group setting, designed to facilitate significant personal growth and spiritual development among its members through deep sharing, accountability, and intentional focus on applying teachings to daily life, leading to meaningful life changes and a closer relationship with God; it goes beyond just studying information to actively cultivate transformation in individuals within the group.

Key points about Transformational Small Groups:

- •Deep relationships- Members build strong connections with each other, fostering a safe space for vulnerability and honest sharing.
- •Active participation- Emphasis on applying teachings to personal situations and actively reflecting on how to live out faith in daily life.
- •Accountability- Group members hold each other accountable for their commitments and spiritual growth.
- •Leader focus- Leaders are trained to guide meaningful discussions and encourage personal reflection.
- •Kingdom-oriented- Focus on how to live out faith in service to others and advancing God's kingdom



The wait is over! I am blessed beyond belief to announce to you that a new small group experience at Knightsville Methodist Church is ready to launch. You have been hearing about it for several months and now we are finally ready to begin to form groups.

First, let me give you a brief introduction. The name says it all. **Going Deeper**, because we seek believers who have a desire to go deeper in many aspects of their relationship with Jesus Christ and others in their small group of fellow believers. The **TLC** part of the name is a catchy way to describe what happens to a group participant as they "Go Deeper." They begin to experience TLC that is "Transforming our Lives through Christ" as a by-product of meeting weekly to pray for the Holy Spirit to come and join them as each member of the group has a "**Sharing The Faith"** moment. While sharing your faith with each other you will talk with each other about your daily and regular **Acts of Piety**, that keep you centered on God's Word. You will share and hear about specific events and times from the past week where you **felt the presence of Christ** walking beside you in your life. You will share, and hear about encounters where you had the opportunity **to be God's beacon of hope for somebody**. In addition, you will share how you and the others feel that **your faith has been tested**. Individually you will declare and hear from others about their **plan for study and action for the coming week**, in order to see our lives through the lens of Christ. Finally, the group will intimately **share prayer requests**, **concerns and praises**. Sounds a little different, right?

This may sound intimidating to some, but don't discount the transformational power of developing close knit bonds with other believers and hearing that we all have the same fears, trials and tribulations. There is something miraculously transforming when you hear stories from others as they recall times from their week where they encountered a situation or event where they felt the closeness of Christ. You will begin to look for and note these occurrences in your own lives, just so you can share at the next small group meeting. And as you transform, your group members will transform. And as the groups transform, our church will begin to transform as well.

Well, are you ready to blast off with us?

The groups are limited to 6 members to insure confidence and intimacy. The meetings will be weekly and the time limit of 60-75 minutes will be stringently adhered to.
