AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

Leader: The Apostles' Creed derives its name from its use in the Christian church from as early as A.D. 150 and the early belief that it was used by the apostles. Beginning in the third century, this Creed was used at baptisms by the Roman Catholic Church. Through the years it has been used widely by both Roman Catholics and Protestants as the formative statement of the faith into which Christians believe.

Leader: Do you believe in God the Father?

People: I believe in God, the Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Leader: Do you believe in Jesus Christ?

People: I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, is seated at the right hand of the Father, and will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Leader: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?

People: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

WORDS OF WISDOM - Isaiah 40:1-11

Isaiah is like a miniature Bible. The first 39 chapters (like the 39 books of the Old Testament) are filled with judgment upon immoral and idolatrous men. Judah has sinned; the surrounding nations have sinned; the whole earth has sinned. Judgment must come, for God cannot allow such blatant sin to go unpunished forever. But the final 27 chapters (like the 27 books of the New Testament) declare a message of hope. The Messiah is coming as a Savior and a Sovereign to bear a cross and a crown to wear.

Allow these words from chapter 40 to open your heart, mind, and your soul to the presence of Almighty God in your life.

Comfort, comfort my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem and proclaim to her that her hard service has been completed, that her sin has been paid for, that she has received from the Lord's hand double for all her sins. A voice of one calling: "In the wilderness prepare the way for the Lord; make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be raised up, every mountain and hill made low; the rough ground shall become level, the rugged places a plain. And the glory of the Lord will be revealed, and all people will see it together. For the mouth of the Lord has spoken." A voice says, "Cry out." And I said, "What shall I cry?" "All people are like grass, and all their faithfulness is like the flowers of the field. The grass withers and the flowers fall, because the breath of the Lord blows on them. Surely the people are grass. The grass withers and the flowers fall but the word of our God endures forever." You who bring good news to Zion, go up on a high mountain. You who bring good news to Jerusalem, lift up your voice with a shout, lift it up, do not be afraid; say to the towns of Judah, "Here is your God!" See, the Sovereign Lord comes with power, and he rules with a mighty arm. See, his reward is with him, and his recompense accompanies him. He tends his flock like a shepherd: He gathers the lambs in his arms and carries them close to his heart; he gently leads those that have young.

May God bless our discernment of His Holy Word.

People: May we ever protect and keep it pure. Amen.

WORD OF GOD - Matthew 9:35-38

Matthew presents Jesus as the Messiah; fulfillment of God's promises to Israel of great blessing and deliverance from captivity and oppression. As the inheritor of David's kingdom, He is King of the Jews. But Matthew's Gospel also reveals Jesus as King of the entire human race. Matthew wrote Jesus' own predictions that all nations will one day bow to Him when He returns in glory. A legion of angels is at His command, and to Him is given all authority in heaven and in earth.

It is vitally important that when the Gospels introduce us to Jesus Christ, we recognize Him in His infinite majesty and divine power. Only then do we begin to understand His grace in taking our sins upon Himself. "You are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins."

Matthew knew Jesus as the Messiah of Israel, as the Savior from sin and judgment, and as king of the whole world. Because of who He is, Matthew followed Jesus. Matthew changed from living for himself and taking material things from others to living for God and being able to give what is of eternal value to others. As you come to know Jesus, God's Son, you will want to follow Him, and listen to His call in your life to witness and serve others.

Today's word of God comes from the 9th chapter, verses 35 and 38.

Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field."

This is the word of God for the people of God.

People: Thanks be to God.
